SUPPLY OF COAL TO THERMAL POWER STATION

- *146 -Q- Sri V.Satyanarayana:-Will the Chief Minister be pleased to state:
- (a) whether coal, required for all the thermal power stations in the State is being supplied in required quantities at present;
- (b) if not the steps taken to ensure supply of required coal to all the thermal power stations in the State; and
 - (c) the quantity of coal required and supplied at present?

A -

- (a) & (b) No Sir. Coal allocations for thermal power stations located in the State are decided upon by an Inter-ministerial Standing Linkage Committee constituted by the Government of India. This Committee finalizes coal supply linkage on a quarterly basis duly taking into account availability of coal. Further, such linkage is provided using transportation by both rail and road. In practice, the Committee has been finalizing coal linkage to each thermal plant sufficient to achieve 68.5% Plant Load Factor. However, the average Plant Load Factor achievement of thermal stations in the State has been well above this level, and infact the average Plant Load Factor achieved in 1995-96 was 78.16%. Consequently, the Andhra Pradesh State Electricity Board has to inevitably finalize the purchase of additional quantities of coal either from Singareni Collieries Company Limited or from Coal India Limited and also arrange for transportation of the same.
 - (c) The answer is placed on the Table of the House.

INCOME DERIVED THROUGH MINERAL CESS

- * 15 -Q- Sri Venkata Satyanarayana :- Will the Minister for Mines and Geology be pleased to state :
- (a) the year wise income derived by the State Government through mineral CESS for the last three years;
- (b) whether it is a fact that the mineral resources in the State could not be exploited completely due to lack of co-ordination between various departments;
 - (c) if so the action, to be taken to achieve better co-ordination;
- (d) what steps the Government propose to take to prevent irregular mining and transportation?

A -

- (a) Consequent on Supreme Court's Judgment dated 26-10-1989 holding mineral rights tax and CESS ultrawires and Govt. of India through Ordinance dated 15.02.92 validating the collection of cess only dated 18.02.92, no income has been derived during the last three years.
 - (b) No Sir.
 - (c) Does not arise.
- (c) The Government has taken various steps for the prevention of illegal mining an illicit transportation which includes creation of Vigilance Cell in Head Office, District and Regional Offices To check the movement of vehicles and also to prevent illegal mining Department Officials have been placed at 75 identified active mining centers resulting in the control illicit mining and derivation of additionally revenues by laying of penalties on offenders.

PRICE OF COTTON YARN.

- *385 -Q- Sarvasri D. Chinnamallaiah, Ch. Rajeswara Rao, C.Vittal Reddy, G.Yadagiri Reddy and K. Biksham:- Will the Chief Minister be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that the price of cotton yarn has gone up in recent times; and
- (b) if so, whether there is any proposal to supply yarn to weavers at reduced rates?

A -

- (a) Prices of cotton yarn had gone up during 1994.
- (b) To help the weavers, Hank yarn Price Subsidy Scheme was implemented during 1994-95 and 1995-96 by supplying yarn at reduced rates.

POWER GENERATION PLANTS AT VISAKHAPATNAM JEGURUPADU, ETC.,

- *518 -O- Sarvasri N. Raghava Reddy. B. Venkateswara Rao, Jakka Venkaiah, and Paturi Ramaiah: -Will the Chief Minister be pleased to state:
- (a) the Stage at which the installation of power Generation Plants at Visakhapatnam, Jegurupadu, Kakinada, Krishnapatnam stands at present; and

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- (b) the time by which they are likely to generate power?
- A -
- (a) & (b) The present stage of installation of Power Generation Plants at Visakhapatnam, Jegurupadu. Kakinada and Krishnapatnam is as follows:
- 1. JEGURUPADU GAS BASED THERMAL POWER STATION (215 MW): The project has received all the statutory clearances necessary. The Modified and Restated Power Purchase Agreement has been concluded on 19-4-1996. The first gas turbine generator has been declared to be on commercial operation on 6.8.1996 and delivering 45.8 MW to Andhra Pradesh Electricity Grid. The erection works on second and third gas turbine and the steam generators along with their auxiliaries are under progress, and are expected to be commissioned during October, 1996 and December, 1996 and the combined cycle operations are expected to commence by 6/97.
- 2. KAKINADA GAS BASED THERMAL POWER STATION (208MW): The project has been cleared by Central Electricity Authority. All the statutory clearances are available for the project. The Modified Power Purchase Agreement concluded on 13.7.1994 is under revision. The civil works of the project are under progress. The first gas turbine generator is expected to be commissioned during September. 1996. The second and third gas turbine generators are expected to be commissioned during December, 1996 and January, 1997 respectively. The combined cycle operation is expected to be commenced by July, 1997.
- 3.1040 MW VISAKHAPATNAM COAL BASED THERMAL POWER STATION: M/s. Hinduia National Power Corporation Limited have originally signed Power Purchase Agreement with Andhra Pradesh State Electricity Board on 9.12.1994 which is being revised after negotiations with the developer and the draft 'Amended and Restated' Power Purchase Agreement has been submitted by the A.P State Electricity Board to Government of Andhra Pradesh on 17.8.1996 for approval and onward transmission to Government of India. The matter is under consideration by Government of Andhra Pradesh. M/s. Hinduja National Power Corporation Limited have submitted revised detailed project report in 3/96 for a plant capacity of 1040 MW (2 X520 MW) at a cost of Rs. 4318 Crores. The Central Electricity Authority, New Delhi has issued Techno Economic Clearance for the project on 25.7.1996 for a completed project cost of US \$ 943.75 Millions + Rs. 1324.993 Crores. The financial closure is expected to be achieved by the Company by December, 1996. The works on the project are likely to be commenced thereafter and the first 520 MW unit is scheduled to be commissioned in 38 months (February 2000) and the 2nd 520MW unit in 44 months (August 2000) from the date of financial closure.

4. KRISHNAPATNAM COAL BASED THERMAL POWER PROJECT: Power Purchase Agreements were signed with M/S.G.V.K. Power Limited, Hyderabad on 23.11.1994 for implementing 500 MW Krishnapatnam 'A' Project and M/s. BBI Power Inc., USA on 24.11.1994 for implementing 500. MW Krishnapatnam 'B' Project. Central Electricity Authority accorded in principle clearance to M/s.G.V.K.Power limited for Krishnapatnam 'A' Project and the same is awaited in respect of Krishnapatnam 'B' Power Project. The modified and restated Power Purchase Agreements are being negotiated with both the developers.

SEIGNIORAGE CESS ON SAND.

- * 547 -Q- F Sri K.Subba Raju:- Will the Minister for Mines and Geology be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that the Government have abolished Seigniorage Cess on Sand at many ferries in the State;
- (b) whether it is also a fact that the contractors are forcibly collecting Seigniorage Cess from the users of sand;
 - (c) if so the steps taken by the Government to check the same?

A -

- (a) Yes Sir, it is fact that the Government had decided from exception of sand quarries without any charges being devoid cloatation of send quarries without any charges being levied or collected with effect from 1st April, 1994. However, the Hon'ble High Court news ordered status quo in respect of policy.
- (b) The lessees were collecting Seigniorage fee from the users of sand in areas, where status quo is ordered by the Hon'ble High Court and the lessees are allowed to continue quarry operations.
- (c) Government has filed counters in Hon'ble High Court and cases are pending before Divisional Bench of High Court.

SALE OF WAKF PROPERTIES.

- *.548-R-Q Sri K.Subba Raju:- Will the Chief Minister be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that the Government propose to ban the sale of. Wakf properties in the state;

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- (b) whether it is a fact that the Commissioner of wakf Board is trying to sell away 16 acres of land out of the properties belonging to Glib Shagged Dargah situated at Bhavanipuram in Vijayawada city;
- (c) whether it is a fact that the 'Vakf Board is trying to alienate 48 acres of land in Sy.No.10 belonging to the same Dargah at a lower price; and
 - (d) the steps being taken by the Government in this matter?

A -

- (a) No such proposal is under consideration of Government. However in Mome.No. 1600/Wakf.2/95-1. dated 6-11-1986 instructed the Secretary, Andhra Pradesh State Wakf Board that permission generally would not be given for disposal of Wakf property. In case disposal of Wakf property becomes inevitable it should only be through Public Auction.
- (b) Sir, on the proposal of Andhra Pradesh State Wakf Board, Government after detailed examination accorded permission to A.P. State Wakf Board in G.O.Ms.No. 1272, Revenue (Wakf) Department dated 8-11-1985 to sell the land measuring Acres 15.23 cents in Survey Number 600 to the tenants.
- (c) No Sir, The Wakf Board recommended to Government the proposals of the Mujawars of the Dargah to sell the land in question through public auction, which is still under examination.
- (d) In G.O.Rt.No. 86, Minorities Welfare Department dated 20-4-1995 Government constituted a Official Committee for joint inspection of site in Survey No. 600. The Committee after inspection of the site recommended to sell lard in terms of Square yards and not in terms of Acres. Accordingly directions have been issued to the Andhra Pradesh State Wakf Board. In respect of Survey No. 10 of Bhavanipuram the case is under examination.

CONSTRUCTION OF BRIDGES ON NATIONAL HIGHWAYS BY PRIVATE AGENCIES.

- * 831-Q- Sri G.S.S. Sivaji:- Will the Chief Minister be pleased to state:
- (a) whether there is any proposal to entrust the construction work and supervision of the bridges to be built on National Highways to Private Agencies:
 - (b) if so, the details of the same?

A -

(a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The bridges on Moosi, Paleru, Maneru, Mudigunda, Gundlakamma and Narrow bridge @ KM.273/6 of N.H.5 on Madras - Vitayewada section in Prakasam District are proposed to be taken up unde. Built Operate and Transfer basis. The proposals received from the private parties were sent to Government of India and its approval is awaited.

RURAL FLECTRIFICATION CO-OPERATION SOCIETIES

- * 840 -Q- Sri G. Babu Rao :- Will the Chief Minister oe pleased to state:
- (a) whether there is any proposal to wind up the Rural Electrification Cooperative Societies in the State and merge them with the Andhra Pradesh State Electricity Board;
- (b) if so, whether the persons working in the Rural Electrification Cooperative Societies will be absorbed in APSEB; and
- (c) whether the National Rural Electrification Corporation, New Delhi was consulted, in this regard?

A-

- a) No Sir
- b) Does not arise.
- c) Does not arise.

AUCTION OF VIDEO CAMERA BY APSRTC

- * 952 -Q- Sri C. Krishna Yadav :- Will the Minister for Transport be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that a Video Camera Worth Rs. 40,000/- was found as lost property in the Gowliguda Central Bus Station on 22nd October,
- (b) whether the said Camera was sold without exhibiting in the auction just for Rs. 250/- to one Sri Paramjyothi, ATM; vide receipt No.731957;
- (c) whether the said camera was purchased for the use of the APSRTC or for the personal use of Sri Paramjyothi, ATM; and
- (d) if the camera was purchased for the use of APSRTC why the receipt was given in the name of the ATM and the action taken to impound the Camera to the RTC and against ATM for the Malpractice?

A-

- (a) Yes, Sir.
- (b) No. Sir. The Video Camera was auctioned to one Sri D. Narender Reddy for an amount of Rs. 14,400/- on 8.3.95 duly following procedure after giving wide publicity.
- (c) Video Camera was not taken by Sri Paramjyothi, but it was taken into T&P account of Corporation till the date of auction i.e., 8.3.95.
- (d) The Departmental Vigilance Inquiry revealed that to facilitate disposal of the Video Camera from the lost property. 2 Money Receipt was issued in favor of Sri Paramjyothi, then the ATM-CBS and on the same day it was taken into Account of APSRTC. It is not a malpractice committed by Sri Paramjyothi but only a procedural lapse. During the enquiry, it was concluded that Sri D.S. Paramjyothi, the then ATM/CBS and Sri M. Nizamuddin, then the Depot Clerk were both held responsible for procedural lapses. Disciplinary action was initiated against the above employees and they were censured.

AYACUT UNDER KANIKALAMMAKONA RESERVIOR IN CHITTOOR DISTRICT.

 - (2) Revised technical approval accorded for Rs. 85.20 lakhs.
- (3) The expenditure incurred so far on head works is Rs. 49.08 lakhs and the total expenditure is Rs. 62.45 lakhs including direct and indirect charges.

SUPPLY OF FARM TO HANDLOOM WEAVERS

- * 1980 -Q- Sarvasri P. Janardhan Reddy, M. Kodanda Reddy, Kanna Lakshmi Narayana and D. Nagender: Will the Chief Minister be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that the workers of Co-operative Handloom Weavers Societies in the State are facing serve hardships due to non-supply of Yarn by the APCO;
- (b) whether it is also a fact that the yarn supplied at subsidized rates is being sold in the market at higher rates by the Presidents of Weavers Societies with the connivance of APCO;
- (c) if so, whether the Government take action against the concerned officials of APACE and Weavers Society leaders and save the poor weavers Community from Starvation?

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- (a) The Primary Weavers Co-operative Societies are sanctioned Credit limits by the Central Co-operative Bank under NABARD refinance scheme as per the Eligibility of the societies. With this cash credit, the societies purchase yarn and undertake production activity through its members. The APCO also supplies yarn to societies against special production program given by APCO to the societies. During 1995, APCO supplied a very little extent of yarn to the societies because of working capital problem as its accounts were frozen by NABARD.
- (b) On preliminary enquire it was found by APCO that one society, iz, Duddanapala Mandloom Weavers Co-operative Society Limited had misused subsidized yard by selling one same in the market.
- (c) The entire subsidy amount of Rs. 93,340/- was recovered from the society. The Procurement Officer and other officers of Divisional marketing officer, Karimnagar were transferred and charges had been framed against them. Enquiry report has been received and the report is under scrutiny.

SECOND ROAD BRIDGE NEAR CHADERGHAT

Whenever necessary private trained machanics are being engaged to repair the bore wells on warfooting bases. There are 144 Departmental Mobile Teams also attending to coope-up with the work-load. Hired mobile teams are being engaged wherever and whenever necessary. The Superintending Engineers are monitoring the maintenance of hand pumps dayto-day, weekly at State level. In place of condemened bore wells new bore wells are being provided in alternative sites, whereever required.

ANNEXURE - I

The Prof. Amrik Singh Committee consisting of 8 members including Principal Secretary was constituted vide G.O.Ms.No.141 Dated 23-4-1994. The terms of reference of this Committee gradually relate to evaluation of administration and programmes of Universities in Andhra Pradesh.

The Committee examined all the Universities by making visits and by having discussions with Vice-Chancellors and teachers of the Universities. The Committee's report which was submitted in July, 1995 was examined by the A.P.State Council for Higher Education. A Sub-committee of Vice-Chancellors of Andhra, Kakatiya and Venkateswara Universities examined the entire report and submitted its response in the month of October, 1995. The response of the sub-committee was placed before all the Vice-Chancellors for their approval. Out of a total number of 205 recommendations Prof. Amrik Singh's Committee identified 71 as major recommendations. Vice-Chancellors agreed to implement these recommendations in a phased manner. The recommendations which do not involve major financial implications will be implemented strightaway. These recommendations are shown in Annexure - II.

ANNEXURE - II

1. Government.

A.P.S.C.H.E. Act to be amended, Recommendation does not seem to take into account the context in which the 1986 commissionerate Act. was passed and the Act of 1988 based on UGC guidelines was passed.

- (b) whether it is also a fact that he did not repay the amount to the Central Cooperative Bank; and
 - (c) if so, the action taken against him so far?

A -

(a) During the tenure of Sri R. Krishna Reddy as President of the Primary Agricultural Co-operative Society, Gummadadala, the said society supplied fertilisers to the ryots by obtaining Bank Guarantee from the Medak District Co-operative Central Bank Limited, Sangareddy to Hyderabad Agricultural Co-operative Association and also under 'B' Component and as open credit from Andhra Pradesh State Co-operative Marketing Federation Limited and Andhra Pradesh State Agro-Industries Development Corporation Limited. However, section 51 enquiry ordered into the affairs revealed that Sri

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- R. Krishna Reddy, Ex-President was found guilty of misappropriation of funds of the society to the tune of Rs.1,14,526.02 by not bringing sale proceeds of fertilisers to the books and by retaining the cash balance with him.
- (b) The Society is due to the Meda's District Cooperative Central Bank Limited, Sangareddy under Short Term Loans an aount of Rs.1.29 lakhs and under Long Term an amount of Rs 0.31 lakhs. It has also to clear fertiliser dues to Hyderabad Agricultural Cooperative Association, Andhra Pradesh State Cooperative Marketing Federation and Andhra Pradesh State Agro-Industries Development Corporation.
- (c) Civil action has been initiated against Sri R. Krishna Reddy, Ex-President for the amount misappropriated by him to the tune of Rs.1,14,526.02. Rs.29.625/- was paid by him and surcharge orders are passed for Rs.1,08,056.00 on 16-3-1996 by Divisional Cooperative Officer, Medak including interest. Criminal action is yet to be taken.

CHARMINAR COOPERATIVE URBAN BANK

- *2273 -Q- Sri K. Raghuram and Smt. Yerneni Sita Devi:- Will the Minister for Cooperation be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that the Chairman and Managing Director and a Director of the Charminar Cooperative Urban Bank Limited, Hyderabad have made heavy borrowings and depleted the bank of finance;
- (b) whether it is also a fact that of the eight thousand share holders of the bank 2,500 share holders did not receive share certificates and that the election of the Chairman, Managing Director andother Directors was manipulated through bogus voters and
 - (c) if so, the action taken against the persons responsible for the same.

A -

- (a) The loans sanctioned to the Vice-Chairman, Managing Director and three other Directors of the Bank are within the limits prescribed by the Reserve Bank of India, the byelaws of the bank and also as per bank rules.
- (b) No, Sir, 8258 members were on rolls at the time of elections. The bank is preparing share certificates and as per the usual practice, the certificates are handed over to the concerned share holder as and when they visits the Bank. So far 7,500 Share Certificates have been issued to the concerned share holders and remaining share certificates are reported to have been kept ready for issue in the bank. As regards elections to the Charminar Cooperative Urban Bank, the Collector, Cooperation/Election Authority had ordered election Vide Pro.No.2229/95-D1, dated 5-10-1995 and appointed Sri S. Pandari, Cooperative

Sub-Registrar as Election Officer and the Cooperative Sub-Registrar conducted the election in accordance with the Rule 22 of the Andhra Pradesh Cooperative Societies Rules of 1964, duly following the required procedure on 5-11-1995 and declared results as per rules.

(c) It is reported that manipulation and bogus voting was neither noticed by the election Officer during the course of election programme nor by the departmental authorities during the elections.

PURCHASES OF SHARES BY APCMF FROM G.I.C.

- (b) The Andhra Pradesh State Cooperative Marketing Federation Ltd., had purchased units of G.I.C. fortune 94 in December, 1994. MARKFED purchased 1,00,000 units of a face value of Rs.10.00 lakhs for Rs.9.75 lakhs only, duly availing a discounts of 2.5% under G.I.C. Fortune 94 Scheme.

MARKFED has reduced all its units on 21-5-1996.

EMBEZZLED IN URBAN BANK IN KARIMNAGAR DISTRICT.

- (a) whether it has been brought to the notice of the Government that an amount of Rs.13.00 lakhs has been embezzled by the Officials of the Urban Bank in Karimnagar District;

- (a) Yes. Sir.
- (b) Yes, Sir. Inspection under Section 52 of A.P.C.S. Act, 1964 was ordered on 29-1-1996 to be carried out by the Divisional Cooperative Officer, Karimnagar. As the Chief Executive Officer (FAC) and the Divisional Cooperative Officer was the same person, a special audit under section 50 of Adhra Pradesh Cooperative Societies Act was ordered. As per the auditors report an amount of Rs.14.35.582 is to be recovered which had been misappropriated. Action is beintg taken under Section 60 of the Andhra Pradesh Cooperative Societies Act, 1964 to recover the amounts from the persons responsible.
- (c) The Bank has susper ded (6) employees of the Bank in January, 1996 for embezzlement of funds. Complaints were also filed with Station House Officer, Karimnagar I Town and Jagtial on 5-2-1996 and 10-2-1996 respectively. The Complaints were registered under Crime No.42/96 of Karimnagar I Town, and Crime No.44/96 of Jagtial Police Station. The cases are under Investigation by Police.
- Sri B. Hanmandlu. Dy Registrar was shifted from that post of Dy. Registrar/Chief Executive Officer of the Karimnagar Coop. Urban Bank Ltd., Karimnagar and the Divisional Cooperative Officer, Karimnagar is holding full additional charge of that post. The Joint Registrar (Vigilance) of the Office of the Commissioner for Cooperation and Registrar of Cooperative Societies has conducted an enquiry on the allegations against Sri B. Hanmandlu and has submitted his report, which is under examination.

FINANCIAL PROBLEMS OF ANDHERA PRADESH COOPERATIVE RICE MILLS FEDERATION

- (b) The RICEFED was ordered for liquidation under section 64 of A.P.C.S. Act as the Society had been incurring heavy losses since its inception and as on 1993-94, the accumulated losses amounted to Rs. 152.21 lakhs. The

Society had to discharge liabilities amounting to Rs.278.96 lakhs to different financial institutions and Government towards margin money and other loans. The audit of accounts was in arrears since 1988-89 and the books of accounts of the RICEFED were not written up-date. Hence the affairs of the Society was ordered for winding up and a liquidator was appointed to discharge the liabilities by realising the assets and, if necessary, by sale of its properties and by retrenchment of the employees, to pay off the debtors. The staff members were ordered for absorption in other departments and all 39 employees working in RICEFED as on the date of Winding up, have been absorbed in other Departments. The Liquidator, as per the provisions of the Act, has to wind up the affairs of the Society expeditiously. Hence there is; no need of financial assistance to the society which is under liquidation.

SANCTION OF LOANS FOR REMOVAL OF SAND BY COOPERATIVE CENTRAL BANK IN KARIMNAGAR DISTRICT.

(c) if so, whether our Government would take up with the Tamilnadu Government to prevent pollutants from entering Pulicot Lake?

- (a) Yes, Sir.
- (b) & (c) The Tamilnadu Government has issued permission to M/S.Thapar Dupant Ltd., on .27-10-95, at Pappamkuppam Village, Gummadipudi Taluk, Changalpattu, MGR District for the manufacture of Nylon Industrial Yarn and Nylon Fabric at an estimated cost of Rs.625 crores, using the raw materials such as Hexamethylene Diamene, Adipic Acid, Phosphorous catalyst, Copper Antioxidant Halide Stabiliser. On enquiry the Tamilnadu Pollution Control Board has informed that the contention of discharging the trade effluents to the Lake seems to be unfounded because the treated effluents are utilised to water the trees in an extent of 85 acres owned by the industry.

COLLECTION OF BEEDI LEAF

* 3334 -Q- Sarvasri Paturu Ramaiah, B.Venkateswara Rao, M.A.Gafoor, S.Venkata Veeraiah, Kunja Bojji, K.Ramulu, N.Rama Mohan Rao,

and Ch. Raji Reddy:- Will the Minister for Forests and Environment be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that beed leaf could not be collected during 1996 at several centres in East and West Godavari and Krishna Districts and if so, the reasons therefore;
- (b) if so, whether the Government are aware of the consequential loss of income and sustenance to the tribals;
- (c) the reason, why the Government has not introduced the system of beedi leaf collection as in Telangana areas atleast in centres where contractors are not coming forward to ensure livelihood to the tribals; and
- (d) The action taken by the Government to do so atleast in future to help the tribals?

A -

- (a) Yes Sir, it is a fact that some Beedi Leave units could not be sold (could not be collected) in East and West Godavari and Krishna Districts inspite of several attempts made for sale of the units during 1996 season for the following reasons.
 - 1. The Beedi Leaf is scattered and poor in quality.
- 2. The investment to be made by the purchaser is heavy compared to the revenue fetched by them.
- 3. Extremist activity is also one of the reasons in Agency areas due to which the bidders are not coming forward to purchase the units. This is more so with units of Rampachodavaram and Yeleswaram which could not be sold in 1994 and 1995 seasons.
- 4. In View of the cyclonic rains received during May, 1995 almost all the contractors incurred heavy losses.
- (b) Yes Sir, There is some loss of income to the tribals. However, the Beedi Leaf is only one of the many M.F.P. items on which the tribals get subtenance.
- (c) In Telangana region a special scheme is sanctioned with a complement of staff for collection of beedi leaf. It is not economical to extend the scheme to Andhra region, in view of small quantity of poor quality of leaf available over a large area.

(d) The Government have no plans to extend the scheme of beedi leaf collection as in Telangana Region to other parts of the State. For the reasons stated in (c) above.

DESTRUTION OF RED SANDERS DUE TO FIRE ACCIDENT IN CHITTOR GODOWN.

(a) Redsanders trees occur over an area of about 1.75 lakh has in Andhra Pradesh in the districts of Cuddapah. Chittoor. Kurnool and Nellore. There is no extraction of Redsanders wood carried out from these forests for the present. However, because of its high value in international market some illegal fellings and smuggling takes place. The smuggling is checked effectively by the Government by deploying various special parties. They have been seizing the produce while under smuggling. The following is the stock position of Redsanders wood seized during the last five years.

(b) No Redsanders wood under the control of Forest Department (Government) is lost in fire in Chittoor District. However, Redsanders wood was destoyed in a fire in the night of 28.6.96 at Renigunta in Chittoor District in a private Depot owned by one Sri A.J.Peter. This wood had been collected from Private lands and stored in a private depot at Renigunta which was stated to have been lost de to fire accident. A discreet enquiry by the Forest Department Officials has revealed that only a quantity of about 123.00 MT was lost due to fire.

SUSPENSIONS OF REGIONAL MANAGERS OF AGRO INDUSTRIES CORPORATION
